The High Court has dismissed the case against Chief Minister Vijay Withdrawn based on an investigation conducted by the Income Tax Department for concealing income

 The High Court has dismissed the case after the case filed against Chief Minister Vijay was withdrawn based on an investigation conducted by the Income Tax Department for concealing income. The Income Tax Department raided the house of Tamil Nadu Chief Minister and actor Vijay in 2015. At that time, the Income Tax Department imposed a fine of Rs. 1.50 crore on Vijay, saying that he had not declared the income of Rs. 15 crore received as salary for



the film 'Puli'. The Madras High Court dismissed the case filed by Chief Minister Vijay against this order last February. In this situation, M. Rajkumar from Kodungaiyur had filed a case in the Madras High Court seeking an order to investigate the documents and valuation measures seized during

the raid conducted by the Income Tax Department at Chief Minister Vijay's house and to file a case against Chief Minister Vijay under the Income Tax Act and under sections of the Indian Penal Code, including cheating and criminal conspiracy, for concealing income. Furthermore, it was

requested that the case documents be sent to the Enforcement Directorate to examine whether there is sufficient evidence to conduct an investigation under the Money Laundering Prevention Act. The case came up for hearing in a bench comprising Chief Justice S.A. Dharmadhikari and Justice G. Arulmurugan. At that time, the petitioner sought permission to withdraw the case. Accordingly, the judges granted permission to withdraw the case and ordered to dismiss it.

Annamalai submitted his resignation letter to BJP national president Nitin Naveen in Delhi Meeting with Minister Amit Shah

 Annamalai met national president Nitin Naveen in Delhi and submitted his resignation letter to quit the BJP. Reports have emerged that he also met Union Home Minister Amit Shah and explained his decision. Annamalai, who quit his IPS job in 2020 and joined the BJP, gained popularity among the youth in a short period of time due to his aggressive political style. Appointed as the BJP state president, he toured extensively throughout Tamil Nadu and projected the party as a major force. However, Annamalai suddenly stepped down as leader ahead of the last assembly elections and was replaced by Nainar Nagendran. This change caused great discontent among Annamalai's supporters. After this change, the BJP formed an alliance with the AIADMK in the Legislative Assembly elections. However, it is said that it was denied the opportunity to contest from Annamalai in the elections. Due to this, it did not participate much in the Annamalai election campaign. The BJP, which contested 27 seats in the AIADMK alliance in the Legislative Assembly elections, suffered a crushing defeat, winning just one constituency. Supporters of Annamalai raised the war flag, blaming the wrong approach of the party leader Nainar Nagendran for this defeat. On the other hand, there were also



rumors that Annamalai was going to start his own party. This long-standing internal conflict in the BJP recently erupted into open conflict over the central government's 'trilingual education policy'. Annamalai issued a statement opposing the central government's decision to implement the trilingual policy from class 9 in CBSE schools. This shocked the BJP leadership. In this situation, Annamalai arrived at the Chennai airport the day before yesterday to go to Delhi. At that time, the BJP flag was not hoisted on his car. When the reporters questioned him about this, he said, "I will speak in detail in two days" and left. Annamalai, who went to Delhi, is understood to have met BJP national organization general secretary P.L. Santosh and national president Nitin Naveen in person yesterday and submitted a 5-page resignation letter. In the 5-page letter, he reportedly detailed his complaints against Nainar Nagendran and L. Murugan, including failure to recognize hard work, being sidelined by se-

nior leaders, being denied the opportunity to contest the Legislative Assembly elections, administrative irregularities in the Tamil Nadu BJP, and others. Union Home Minister Amit Shah, who learned of Annamalai's decision to resign, personally called him and held a meeting. Senior RSS leaders also tried to pacify Annamalai. However, he is said to be firm on his decision. Annamalai is expected to make a major announcement about his next political move on June 4 (tomorrow), his birthday. His supporters are excitedly saying that he is likely to launch a new political movement or party with a focus on "spirituality and nationalism". Following Annamalai's decision, Many of his supporters and district administrators in the Tamil Nadu BJP are resigning from their posts. This drastic move by Annamalai has created a major rift within the Tamil Nadu BJP. To prevent the situation from getting out of hand, the Delhi High Court is now engaging in serious conciliatory measures. The Delhi High Court has urgently summoned state

president Nainar Nagendran to personally explain the allegations made by Annamalai in his 5-page letter. After Nainar Nagendran was asked for an explanation, Delhi political sources are reporting that there may be a drastic change in the leadership of the Tamil Nadu BJP. Until then, reliable sources are reporting that Union Home Minister Amit Shah has instructed Annamalai, who is staying in Delhi, not to announce any decision in public in a hurry. Although Annamalai submitted his resignation letter to the national president in person, he has not officially announced his departure from the BJP. Even in the 'bio' of his social media pages, he has so far referred to himself as 'BJP administrator'. The question arises whether Annamalai's calmness, even after submitting his resignation letter, is a sign of the importance he is being given by the Delhi government or a chance to make concessions. It is expected that this political suspense will be fully resolved on his birthday, June 4 (tomorrow)

RISING CESAREAN DELIVERIES in India

Over the past few years, the number of Cesarean Section deliveries in India has been steadily increasing. The practice of delivering a baby via surgery—rather than through natural childbirth—has become a common occurrence in many hospitals. This shift has sparked significant debate within the medical community, society at large, and among the general public. A Cesarean delivery is a surgical procedure in which a baby is delivered by making incisions in the mother's abdomen and uterus. In certain emergency medical situations, it is considered a critical intervention that saves the lives of both the mother and the child. The World Health Organization (WHO) states that a Cesarean delivery rate of 10 to 15 percent is



sufficient for any given country. However, in many Indian states, this rate has surged to between 30 and 60 percent. Studies indicate that the rate of Cesarean deliveries is particularly high in private hospitals. In some facilities, more than half of all deliveries are performed via the Cesarean method. There are several reasons for this increase. Foremost among them is the rising age of pregnant women; currently, many women are conceiving after the age of 30. As maternal age increases, the likelihood of complications during pregnancy also rises. Consequently, doctors often find it necessary to recommend a Cesarean delivery. Underlying health conditions—such as high blood pressure, diabetes, and obesity—also contribute to the rising Cesarean rates. Furthermore, modern lifestyles characterized by a lack of physical exercise and unhealthy dietary habits play a role in this trend. In certain instances, a Cesarean delivery becomes medically necessary when the baby is in an abnormal position or when complications involving the umbilical cord arise. The presence of twins or multiple fetuses in the womb also creates a situation where surgical intervention is required. Women who have previously undergone a Cesarean delivery are highly likely to require an-

other Cesarean for subsequent births. As a result, the rate of Cesarean deliveries continues to climb from one generation to the next. Advancements in medical technology are also viewed as a contributing factor. As prenatal monitoring has become highly precise, doctors often opt for a Cesarean section out of caution in situations perceived to carry a risk. Some women, driven by a fear of labor pain, voluntarily request a Cesarean section. Family preferences—such as the desire for the baby to be born on a specific date—also occasionally exert an influence. There are also criticisms suggesting that in private hospitals, the rate of Cesarean sections is rising due to factors related to time management and convenience. However, it cannot be claimed that all Cesarean

sections are unnecessary. In many instances, it serves as a life-saving medical procedure. In situations where the mother's life is at risk, a Cesarean section proves to be an immense blessing. At the same time, unnecessary Cesarean sections can lead to adverse health effects. The recovery period following the surgery is typically longer than that of a natural delivery. The mother may face risks such as pain, infection, and excessive bleeding. There is also a possibility of complications arising in subsequent pregnancies. Some studies suggest that the infant, too, may face certain health challenges. Research indicates that certain microbial protections acquired during a natural delivery may be diminished in a Cesarean delivery. Consequently, medical profession-

als emphasize that Cesarean sections should be performed only in situations where they are medically necessary. Pregnant women must be provided with accurate and adequate information. Fears surrounding childbirth need to be alleviated. Prenatal exercises and yoga, among other practices, help enhance the likelihood of a natural delivery. A nutritious diet also plays a pivotal role. Government hospitals are implementing initiatives designed to encourage natural deliveries. Doctors and patients must collaborate to make appropriate decisions. The method of delivery should be determined based on the woman's physical health, the condition of the baby, and medical advice. A Cesarean section is not inherently wrong. Nor can it be asserted that a nat-

ural delivery is the only correct option. Both have their own distinct benefits and requirements. The paramount concern is the safety of both the mother and the child. There is a need for constructive dialogue regarding the rising incidence of Cesarean deliveries in India. It is also essential to reduce the performance of Cesarean sections in the absence of medical indications. At the same time, refusing a Cesarean section when it is medically necessary can be dangerous. A balanced approach constitutes the optimal solution. The well-being of the mother and the safety of the child must be accorded primary importance. Only then can a healthy society be fostered. Cultivating a proper understanding of Cesarean deliveries among the general public is the need of the hour.

Ancestral Property... Stalled Sales of Personal Plots or Homes? 8 Powerful Remedies

While legal solutions exist for all types of property disputes, individuals who feel they have been denied their rightful justice—or those who simply wish to expedite the resolution of a pending lawsuit—may choose to perform certain spiritual remedies. Elders say that when these remedies are performed with unwavering faith, property-related problems will gradually dissipate.



1 REMEDY 1

Those facing issues regarding ancestral property are advised to perform the following ritual every Sunday: before eating their morning meal, mix a small amount of rice with jaggery and feed it by hand to a cow that has recently calved.

2 REMEDY 2

Worship Goddess Varahi Amman for eight consecutive Saturdays—between 6:00 AM and 7:00 AM, or 8:00 PM and 9:00 PM. Light a lamp in an earthen agal using sesame oil, with a wick wrapped in dark blue cloth containing white mustard seeds. You can regain lost property, wealth, fame, and honor.

4 REMEDY 4

To sell a property that has been unsold for long, on any Tuesday: cut a Kandangkathi fruit into four pieces and place one piece in each corner of your land. Squeeze four tomatoes—one at each corner. Then sprinkle cumin water at all corners, dig small pits, place blunt-tipped scissors in them and cover with soil. Pray for swift resolution.

5 REMEDY 5

If you provide at least one meal to elderly, destitute individuals on Fridays, ancestral property issues will resolve smoothly. Daily worship of Sri Lakshmi Narasimha during Pradosham (4:30 PM to 6:00 PM) will help resolve legal complications quickly.

6 REMEDY 6

String a garland of red hibiscus flowers and offer it to the Goddess (Amman) at a nearby temple on Fridays. Worshipping her in this manner will remove obstacles in ancestral property matters and help legal cases reach a quick conclusion.

7 REMEDY 7

Worker Dies After Consuming Poison

Thirumangalam, June 2:

A man estimated to be around 40 years old was found dead near a tender coconut stall on Usilampatti Main Road in Kandukulam village, located near Thirumangalam. Upon receiving this information, the Thirumangalam Taluk Police visited the scene, recovered

the body, sent it to the Thirumangalam Government Hospital for a post-mortem examination, and initiated an investigation. The inquiry revealed that the deceased was Suriyadevar (41) from Saathangudi, and that he had died after consuming poison. The Taluk Police are continuing their investigation into this incident.

Awareness Program on Fertilizer Management Near T. Palur

T. Palur, June 3:

An awareness training program on fertilizer management was held near T. Palur. A campaign focused on farm safety and an awareness drive—organized by the Cholamadevi Krishi Vigyan Kendra (KVK), located near T. Palur in the Ariyalur district—is being conducted from the 1st through the 30th of this month. During this campaign, detailed explanations and practical demonstrations will be provided regarding key techniques such as the importance of soil testing, applying fertilizers based on soil test results, the cultivation of green manure crops, organic farming practices, and the preparation of agricultural inputs. Farmers will also be provided with necessary advice and guidance on agriculture and allied sectors. On the inaugural day (the

1st), awareness camps focusing on farm safety and balanced fertilizer management were held in the villages of Amirtharayan Kottai, Vanathirayanpattinam, and Porpodhinthanallur. In each of these villages, more than 50 farmers participated in and benefited from the program. Yesterday, similar camps were conducted in the villages of Elakurichi and Poondi within the Thirumanur block. Furthermore, an awareness and training session on balanced fertilizer management was held in Olai village, located in the Andimadam block. The camp was led by the Centre's Senior Scientist and Head, Mr. Alagu Kannan, who outlined the objectives of the program. The Centre's technical experts—Ms. Rajkala, the participating farmers expressed their gratitude.

30 Indians arrested for driving trucks illegally in the US

New York

30 Indians have been arrested for illegally living in the US and working as truck drivers. They will soon be deported. A statement issued by the US Customs and Border Protection Agency said: From May 11 to 15, Border Patrol agents in the Yuma Sector of Arizona arrested 52 people who were illegally in the United States under the program "Operation Checkmate". Of these, 36 were found to be driving heavy trucks. Of the arrested drivers, 30 were from India. The others were from Mexico, El Salvador and Russia. They had commercial driver's licenses from states



such as California, New York, Washington, and Virginia. Some did not have any driver's licenses at all. Most of them had employment authorization documents obtained during the Joe Biden administration. But they have now expired. All those arrested are subject to investigation under federal law and are subject to deportation, it said. The statement added, "Operation Check-

mate is intended to enhance public safety by identifying and apprehending illegal individuals operating commercial vehicles in the United States and enforcing civil rights laws. Operation Checkmate demonstrates our commitment to protecting our communities and our roads from illegal drivers, who pose a significant threat to public safety." Sector Chief Officer Dustin Cadill said.

Netanyahu, Trump clash over Israel's attack on Lebanon

Washington

US President Trump has issued a stern warning to Netanyahu over the phone for his attack on Lebanon, which he said would derail the peace effort. The US and Israel launched an attack on Iran in late February. This sparked a war in the Middle East. Following this, the US, which declared a ceasefire last April, is holding peace talks with Iran. In this situation, Israel is carrying out a serious attack on Lebanon in a way that hinders America's efforts. This has angered US President Donald Trump. In response,



the American media outlet Axios reported that Trump's recent phone call with Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu turned into a heated argument. You are a fool. Trump, who lashed out at Netanyahu with extremely harsh words during the phone call, also accused him of being ungrateful. Referring to Netanyahu's corruption case, he said,

"If it weren't for me, you would be in prison right now. I'm the one who's saving you." "But because of your actions, the whole world hates you and Israel. You are a fool." Trump said angrily. After the phone call, Trump confirmed on his social media page that Netanyahu had accepted his request not to launch a large-scale attack on Lebanon.

US fighter jet destroys radar in Iran

Tehran

The United States has destroyed Iranian air defense systems and telecommunications towers in retaliation for Iran's shooting down of a US MQ-1 drone. A US MQ-1 drone was on a surveillance mission in international waters

when it was shot down by Iran a few days ago. Iran said it shot it down because it entered Iranian airspace. In response, US warplanes bombed air defense systems, ground control centers, and a communications tower on Iran's Sirik Island in the Qoruk

and Qeshm islands last Saturday and Sunday. Iran has said that if the US continues its attacks on Iran, its response will be different. Despite the ceasefire talks between Iran and the US, such attacks continue to occur from time to time.

Indian border issue

People protest demanding the resignation of Nepal Prime Minister

Kathmandu

People in Nepal are protesting against Prime Minister Balendra Shah's comments on the Indian border issue. The people involved in this protest are demanding his resignation. Nepal's Prime Minister Balendra Shah told the Nepali parliament on Sunday that the border issue between India and Nepal is not a unilateral issue. His comments have angered the people of the country. Balendra Shah took office as the Prime Min-

ister of Nepal last March. The RSP, a party supported by the youth, formed the government in the general election. Balendra Shah is the leader of that party. He became the Prime Minister through a change of government following the protests of the young generation. Currently, protests have erupted in Nepal against his government. Opposition parties are also fighting alongside the protesting youth. People are saying that Balendra Shah

is speaking against the sovereignty of the country. The areas of Lipulekh, Limpiyadhura and Kalapani are known as an integral part of India. Nepal has been celebrating this as its own. India has reacted strongly to this at various times. In such a situation, Balendra Shah suggested that Britain could participate in the border dispute between the two countries. In response, India has said that there is no place for a third party in the India-Nepal border issue.

Change in registration rules for foreigners staying in India for 180+ days

New Delhi

The central government has changed the registration rules for foreign nationals who wish to stay in India for more than 180 days. Accordingly, instead of having to register after the 180-day period has expired, it will now be mandatory for them to register themselves before that. Under



the amended rules, Indian nationals on visas with a validity of 180 days or less, who wish to extend their stay, can register themselves at any time before the 180-day limit expires. These changes have been brought about

through amendments made to the Immigration and Foreigners Rules 2025. This new measure is in contrast to the previous practice of registering within 14 days after the expiry of 180 days from the date of entry into India. In addition, these revised rules will also apply to those holding visas valid for more than 180 days.

Pawan Kalyan confirms contesting Telangana elections

Hyderabad

Jana Sena leader Pawan Kalyan said that the party will contest the upcoming elections in Telangana in 2028. The 13th Independence Day of Telangana was celebrated with great pomp and ceremony yesterday. The Jana Sena Party has organized a public meeting in Hyderabad to celebrate the Independence Day of Telangana. But the Telangana Police refused permission citing law and order issues. The Hyderabad High Court refused to entertain the petition filed against it as an urgent petition. Due to this, the public meeting was cancelled.



Meanwhile, Jana Sena Party leader and Andhra Pradesh Deputy Chief Minister Pawan Kalyan told reporters at his residence in Hyderabad: When Telangana was bifurcated, I said that the way it was divided was wrong. The division was not wrong. I said that we can separate like brothers without fighting. Should I not come to Telangana for that? Regionalism is worse than ter-

rorism. That is, being divided by language, state, and preventing others from coming in is very cruel. People like you, Rahul Gandhi, Priyanka Gandhi, can contest anywhere they want in the southern states. But what is the reason that we cannot hold a single meeting here? I have not thought that I will contest in Telangana till now. But I am saying it now. In the coming 2028 Telangana elections, the Jana Sena Party will contest as a single party. Will it contest alone? Or will it contest in an alliance like Andhra Pradesh? We will know later. Pawan Kalyan said this.

Tamil Nadu BJP letter to Delhi Chief Minister: Sakkurpur Metro station should be named after Thiruvalluvar

New Delhi

Sakkurpur is one of the Tamil-dominated areas in Delhi. As a result, 33 years ago, the Municipal Corporation of Delhi named a road in Sakkurpur Colony as 'Thiruvalluvar Marg'. A new pink metro line was laid through Sakkurpur six years ago. Tamils living in Delhi demanded that it be named 'Thiruvalluvar Metro Station'. In this context, a consultative meeting of the State Renaming Commission was held on Wednesday, chaired by Delhi Chief Minister Rekha Gupta. In this, the Delhi government gave its approval to strength-

en local identities and rename metro stations and public places across the national capital. Meanwhile, Tamil Nadu BJP co-convenor Nachiyappan, in a letter to Chief Minister Rekha Gupta, said, "The state name change commission had been accepting this demand that has been raised by the Tamils living in Delhi for the last 8 years. This was hindered by the spread of Corona in the meantime. Therefore, I request the Chief Minister to immediately fulfill this long-standing demand and name the Sakkurpur Metro Rail Station after Thiruvalluvar." M. Nadesan, general

secretary of the Delhi Tamil Cultural Association, who took the first initiative for this, told 'Hindu Tamil Veer', "EPS, who was the Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu, and TAMAK leader G.K. Vasan also gave a letter of support to keep the name Thiruvalluvar. "For this, we have personally urged former Chief Minister Kejriwal and Prime Minister Modi in 2018. It is welcome that the BJP has also joined in urging Thiruvalluvar. We are confident that the Delhi government will announce Thiruvalluvar's name without delay," he said.

Commotion Near Secretariat Entrance as Man Attempts Self-Immolation

Chennai

A commotion ensued near the entrance of the Secretariat after a man attempted to set himself on fire. The individual, identified as Ezhilarasan from the Villupuram district, made the attempt near the entrance of the Chennai Secretariat complex. Security personnel on duty intervened to prevent the act and subsequently questioned him. During the inquiry, Ezhilarasan alleged that he had been defrauded of ₹7 lakh by individuals who promised to secure a loan for him to build a house. He further claimed that despite filing multiple complaints with the Villupuram District Police regarding this matter, no First Information Report (FIR) had been registered, and officials had failed to take any action. He stated that he attempted self-immolation out of sheer desperation, noting that whenever he tried to enter the premises to submit a petition regarding this issue, police personnel refused to grant him entry. This incident caused a significant stir in the area. The police personnel stationed at the security post calmed him down and conducted further inquiries. An investigation into the incident is currently underway.

Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly Secretary K. Srinivasan suddenly resigned yesterday. Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly Secretary K. Srinivasan was appointed as the Assembly Secretary in 2018. Previously, he served as an assistant to the Speaker of the Assembly, D. Jayakumar, and P. Dhanapal. While he was Dhanapal's assistant, he was appointed as the Secretary of the Assembly. Following the AIADMK regime, he served as the Legislative Assembly Secretary in the DMK government for the last 5 years. On November 30, 2023, when he retired after completing the age of 60, the DMK government promoted him to the post of Principal Secretary and extended his

tenure for 3 years, i.e. until November 30 this year. In this situation, the government headed by Chief Minister Vijay took office last month after a change of government. He effectively conducted various legislative events that took place thereafter. With the budget session about to begin soon, Secretary Srinivasan suddenly submitted his resignation letter to Assembly Speaker J.C.T. Prabhakar yesterday afternoon. 10 Dead in Fire at Restaurant in Delhi
