Chennai June 10

Chief Minister Vijay is leaving for Delhi today to participate in the NITI Aayog meeting to be held tomorrow under the chairmanship of Prime Minister Narendra Modi. Vijay, who took oath as the Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu on May 10, visited Delhi for the first time on May 27 and met Prime Minister Modi. At that time, he submitted a petition containing various demands, including necessary projects and financial allocation for Tamil Nadu. Later, Chief Minister Vijay also met Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman



and requested her to fulfill the demands, including the pending funds to be given to Tamil Nadu. In this situation, Chief Minister Vijay is going to Delhi today for the second time on a 3-day visit. The NITI Aayog meeting with all state Chief Ministers, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, will be held in Delhi tomorrow on the 11th. Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman and

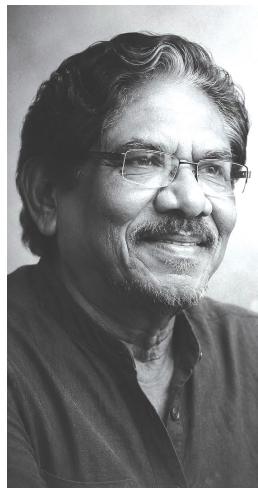
Defense Minister Rajnath Singh will also participate in the meeting. Chief Minister Vijay, who will participate in the meeting, is expected to meet Prime Minister Modi and Union Minister Amit Shah after the meeting. Apart from this, he will also meet President Draupadi Murmu and Vice President CP Radhakrishnan during this trip. Last time, Chief Minister Vijay had gone to Delhi

and was scheduled to meet senior leaders of the Congress party, Sonia Gandhi and Rahul Gandhi. However, it was reported that Rahul Gandhi could not meet him as he was on other work. In this situation, it is said that Chief Minister Vijay will meet Sonia and Rahul Gandhi in Delhi. For this, Chief Minister Vijay will reach Chennai's Meenambakkam airport at around 8 am and will leave for Delhi from there by a private flight. After completing his 3-day trip, he will return to Chennai by a private flight from Delhi on the evening of June 12 at around 6 pm, according to reports.

I pray that his soul rests in the eternal peace of God. In appreciation of Bharathi Raja's contribution to the film industry and to pay tribute to him, state honors will be

accorded to his final journey," Chief Minister Vijay announced. Earlier, Chief Minister Vijay paid his respects by garlanding the body of director Bharathi Raja, which was kept at the Neelankarai residence. Director Bharathiraja, who had been receiving treatment in the hospital for the past few months due to old age, passed away this morning.

Advice to fill more vacancies TNPSC Chairman information

Chennai June 10

TNPSC Chairman S.K. Prabhakar announced that instructions have been issued to fill more vacancies in government departments and that all competitive examinations will be conducted as per the annual examination schedule. With the change of government in Tamil Nadu and the new government taking office, expectations have arisen among candidates preparing for competitive exams as to how government department appointments will be made. When asked about this, TNPSC Chairman S.K. Prabhakar said: The Human Resources Department has issued an advisory to fill the large number of vacancies in government departments. The TNPSC is also being

consulted regarding the expeditious filling of vacancies in government departments. As per the TNPSC Annual Examination Schedule for the year 2026, the competitive examinations will be conducted after the announcement of the notification. The first such notification for the Integrated Technical Services Examination (positions without an interview) was issued on May 20th and applications are being received online. A supplementary notification will be published as new vacancies become available. Similarly, the number of vacancies can be added in the same manner. The notification for Group-1 examination will be published on June 23. Details regarding the posts and vacancies will

be included in the notification. Similarly, notifications for all examinations will be published in due time and the examination results will also be published soon. Last year, for the first time, assistant posts were filled through TNPSC at Tamil Nadu Dr. MGR Medical University. This year, there are vacancies in non-teaching posts from various government universities. Depending on the level of the post, those posts will be included in the Combined Group-2 Examination or Group-2A Examination. It has been announced that 15,000 vacancies will be filled in the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board soon. Therefore, those vacancies will also be filled gradually through the TNPSC. He said this.

CM Vijay launches Sinhapen Special Task Force Decision to create 2,500 new jobs

Chief Minister Vijay yesterday launched the Sinhapen Special Task Force to improve the safety of women and children in Tamil Nadu. 2,500 new jobs will be created under this scheme. The Chief Minister assured that an environment will be created where women and children can live without fear. In Tamil Nadu, Thaweka leader Vijay signed three bills after taking charge as the Chief Minister. One of them is the Singapore Special Task Force. The inaugural ceremony of this task force, which is designed to improve the safety of women and children, was held at the Rajaratnam Ground in Egmore, Chennai yesterday. Chief Minister Vijay launched the Singapore Women's Special Task Force. Later, a parade of patrol vehicles of this force took place. Chief Minister Vijay drove a patrol vehicle. Later, at the ceremony, Chief Minister Vijay spoke as follows: We said that we would ensure the safety of our fathers, mothers, aunties, daughters and girls. It was not just an election slogan. It was a sentimental one. When it



comes to atrocities against women, we always have zero tolerance. We are very firm on that. All women and girls in Tamil Nadu should be safe and confident. When I hear about some incidents involving women, my heart is truly shaken. My eyes are filled with tears. When I examine why crimes against women are happening, it all comes down to one thing. It is drug trafficking. It needs to be uprooted. As a result of ignoring this problem for many years, its roots have spread deep. I don't need to tell you who is ignoring this. Drug trafficking, atrocities against women, and law and order issues are all interrelated. How are we going to fix this? At the same time, if you ask me whether the protection of women and girls is only related to law and order, then

no. It involves social order and individual order. Therefore, only when an individual is disciplined, that society will change on its own. With discipline and responsibility, many problems can be solved. We must create an environment where women can live their daily lives without fear, whether at their places of study, at their workplace, or while traveling. That is our first goal. Harassment of women by anyone cannot be tolerated. Action against them will be taken strictly by the police department. A complaint will be filed very soon. But the authorities must keep in mind that no innocent person should be punished in this. The first phase of the Women's Special Task Force will see an allocation of over Rs. 354 crore. 2,500 new posts will be

created for this force alone. Therefore, the Women's Special Task Force will act as an additional force to the organizations working for the protection of women. This force will play a key role in preventing crimes against women before they occur. The involvement of the force in field work and proactive operations will enable all women police stations to focus more on investigating cases and prosecuting offenders. Drone patrolling will be introduced for the first time in India to prevent crimes against women. DGP Mahesh Kumar Agarwal presented a memento to the Chief Minister. Chief Secretary M. Sai Kumar, Chennai Police Commissioner Amalraj and many others participated in the event.

Varanasi, also known as Kashi, is one of the most popular holy cities in Uttar Pradesh. Various development projects are being implemented here, which is Prime Minister Modi's constituency. One of them is the Oxygen Park, which is being developed in 20 acres of land in the Belupur area of Varanasi at a cost of Rs 100 crore. The city government is developing the park under the name 'Shiva Theme Park'. The theme of the park will be the Kashi Vishwanath Temple and Lord Shiva. The park is being developed at a world-class level. In the next 8 to 9 months, the park will have a huge walkway, modern swings for children, an open-air art gallery,



a library for the elderly, a huge parking lot and a food court. The achievements of Padma awardees and prominent personalities from Kashi will also be showcased here. A planetarium will be set up here to attract youth and children to the field of space science and astronomy. The park will be designed to provide spiritual peace to the visitors. Apart from being a place of worship, it will also become a major hub for environment, science and urban development. A modern digital museum is being set

up here to showcase the ancient heritage, historic temples and mythological stories of Kashi. The most important feature is the world's tallest Shiva Lingam, which is 130 feet high. Currently, there is a 111-foot Mahalingam in Chengalpatu, Kerala. The Virat Ramayana temple in East Champaran, Bihar, also houses a Shiva Lingam. This Shiva Lingam, made of a single stone, is 33 feet tall. It is noteworthy that it was recently donated to Bihar by sculptors from Mahabalipuram, Tamil Nadu.

Two key accused arrested in case of kidnapping Indian youth to Southeast Asian cyber fraud camps

New Delhi june 10

The CBI has arrested two key accused in a case of luring Indian youth to cyber fraud camps in South East Asia on the pretext of offering them high-paying jobs abroad. They have been identified as Nipendra Chaudhary and Nilesh Narpatsin Purohit. CBI officials said: "The investigation has exposed a network of agents and facilitators who smuggled Indian youth to Southeast

Asian countries. The Indian youth were smuggled to fraudulent camps in Myanmar and Cambodia." There, their passports were confiscated and they were forced to engage in cyber-crime. Many of them were physically and mentally tortured. The arrested person, Nibender Chowdhury, was working on behalf of a fraudster. He was instrumental in arranging the transportation of Indians to Myanmar via Thailand. The

youths were flown to Bangkok, taken to Mae Sot, and then illegally crossed the Thailand-Myanmar border to be taken to the smuggling camps in Myanmar. The second accused, Nilesh Purohit, managed a network of sub-agents across India on behalf of the smuggling camp operators. He operated from a fraud camp office near the Thailand-Myanmar border. The two received money through cryptocurrency, they said.

India has 12 nuclear bombs ready for attack Stockholm International Peace Research Institute

India has 12 nuclear bombs on standby, an international research institute has said. The Stockholm International Peace Research Institute, a European country based in Sweden, has been studying the military strength of countries around the world and publishing a report every year. Accordingly, the study report for the year 2026 was recently published. It states: Nine countries in the world have nuclear weapons. Russia has 4,400 nucle-



ar warheads. The United States has 3,700 nuclear warheads. China has 620, France has 290, Britain has 225, India has 190, Pakistan has 170, Israel has 90, and North Korea has 60 nuclear weapons. India

India in 5th place
The United States is the world's largest military spender, spending \$954 billion annually, followed by China (\$336 billion), Russia (\$190 billion), and Germany (\$114 billion). India is in 5th place with \$92.1 billion (about Rs. 8.77 lakh crore). India and Ukraine are among the top 5 countries importing the most weapons in the world during the period 2021-25.

has increased its nuclear arsenal compared to last year. That day, 12 nuclear warheads were mounted on missiles and kept ready for attack. In May last year, war broke out between India and Pakistan. However, both countries implemented a ceasefire and defused the tension. Former DMK minister Thangam Thenarasu has said that "some people are deliberately distorting and spreading the words of DMK leader M.K. If you open the newspapers and television channels, you will see news of murder, robbery, sexual assault, and drug trafficking. Unfortunately, the ruling party Thaweka executives themselves have been directly involved in various criminal incidents. A woman from the ruling party was sexually assaulted by her own



party members, and the perpetrators have been arrested. However, no action has been taken against the ruling party MLA accused by the woman. US Massachusetts federal court rules to overturn Trump’s H1B visa fee hike

Washington june 10
US court overturns H1B visa fee hike. The US government introduced the H1B visa in 1990. Through this, US companies have been hiring skilled foreign workers on a temporary basis. The fee for the H1B visa ranged from \$1,000 to \$7,500 (Rs. 1 lakh to Rs. 6 lakh). In September last year, US President Donald Trump raised the H1B visa fee to one lakh dollars (Rs. 95 lakhs). This was strongly opposed by US multinational corporations and the Democratic Party. In this context, a lawsuit was filed in the Massachusetts federal court in December last year on behalf of 20 state governments, including California, Massachusetts, Arizona, Colorado, Connecticut,



cut, Delaware, Hawaii, Illinois, Maryland, Michigan, and Minnesota, challenging the increase in H1B visa fees. Judge Leo D. Sorokin heard the case and delivered his ruling the day before yesterday. “President Trump has increased the H1B visa fee without the approval of the US government. This is illegal. Therefore, the H1B visa fee increase is canceled,” the ruling stated. Commenting on the ruling, US President Trump said, “Federal Court cases are a great challenge. It is a great pain to fight the rules of the court.

It is very disappointing to see judges acting against the best interests of our country.” US Secretary of the Interior Mark Wayne Mullen said, “President Trump is acting in a way that prioritizes citizens and families. The H1B visa cap was raised to prevent foreigners from taking over American jobs.” “Foreigners are causing a lot of trouble throughout the country. The country’s culture is being destroyed,” he said. White House Press Secretary Taylor Rogers said, “The U.S. government will appeal the Mas-

sachusetts federal court’s decision on the H-1B visa fee hike. We are confident that the appeal will result in a favorable decision for the American people.” The US government issues H1B visas to 65,000 foreigners a year. 73 percent of those who receive these visas are Indians. Indian IT professionals have wholeheartedly welcomed the decision of the Massachusetts federal court. Kuldeep Kumar, who works in the US, said, “America’s leading IT companies, hospitals, financial institutions, and research institutes are employing Indian experts in large numbers. American companies have been hit hard by the H1B visa. American companies have welcomed the recent court ruling.”

Protest against ban on JAAC organization in occupied Kashmir 30 killed in firing by Pakistani army

Islamabad june 10
Protests have intensified in Pakistan-occupied Kashmir. 30 people have been killed in clashes between protesters and Pakistani troops. Top Pakistani officials banned the formation of the JAAC last Friday, citing general law and order and security concerns in Pakistan-occupied Kashmir. Protests erupted in various parts of Pakistan-occupied Kashmir against the ban. A trader was killed in a clash with security forces last Friday night. Following this, clashes broke out at several places in Rawalpindi. In this regard, Commissioner Sardar Waheed Khan, the top civil officer of Rawalpindi, said, “Last Sunday, JAAC protesters



gathered outside the hospital morgue. As a tense situation developed at the place, the security forces tried to disperse the protesters. “Then the group members attacked them using automatic rifles, petrol bombs and other weapons. When the security forces retaliated, 6 protesters were killed,” he said. Meanwhile, villagers and JAAC supporters have denied the government’s official figures, saying the civilian death toll is much higher. The protests intensified

yesterday. This was followed by fierce clashes between the protesters and the Pakistani military. Many people lost their lives in this. As of yesterday evening, 30 people had died. More than 200 were injured and are receiving treatment. The clashes took place in the backdrop of the JAAC calling for a strike to protest the reservation of 12 seats for refugees out of the 45 seats for the legislative assembly elections to be held in the region on July 27.

Rohit, Pandya ready for ODI series

Senior star batsman Rohit Sharma and all-rounder Hardik Pandya have been declared fully fit to play in the ODI series against Afghanistan. Rohit Sharma and Hardik Pandya missed some parts of the IPL due to a hamstring injury and a back injury, respectively. Both of them have been receiving treatment and training at the BCCI Centre of Excellence in Bengaluru since the 2nd. Their condition has been monitored by the medical team there. Rohit Sharma and Hardik Pandya have been declared fully fit after undergoing various tests, the BCCI’s fitness centre has said. The duo will be back in action for the three-match ODI series against Afghanistan starting on the 13th.

Iran shoots down US helicopter Trump warns of retaliation

Washington june 10
US President Donald Trump has said that the Iranian military has shot down a sophisticated American Apache helicopter that was patrolling the Strait of Hormuz. President Donald Trump, who posted on his Truth Social social media page, said, “I have just received information from our military officials. Last night, Iranian forces shot down a sophisticated American Apache helicopter while it was patrolling over the Strait of Hormuz.” He also said that the two pilots who were in the helicopter in the accident were fortunately rescued without any injuries.



However, Trump stated that the United States will not ignore this attack and warned, “However, the United States must respond appropriately to this brutal attack.”The Apache helicopter crashed at 3:30 a.m. Monday off the coast of Oman, the U.S. military’s Central Command said. Within two hours of the crash, the two pilots were safely rescued by a sea-borne drone belonging to Task Force 59, a division of the

U.S. Fifth Fleet, and then flown to safety by another helicopter. This is the first time in U.S. military history that a drone has successfully rescued soldiers who fell into the sea.Although the US Department of Defense has not yet released a formal investigation report into the cause of the helicopter downing, President Trump has declared it a direct attack by Iran and said he will retaliate, causing a stir in the Middle East.

35 kg of ganja worth Rs. 10 lakh seized in Kerala: 4 West Bengal workers arrested

The state police have received confidential information that a large amount of drugs are being smuggled into Kerala through West Bengali workers working in Kerala. Based on this, the District Narcotics Control Unit and Perumbavoor police jointly stopped and searched two autorickshaws carrying West Bengal workers in the Vazhakulam area of Ernakulam district.



They seized 35 kg of cannabis hidden in small pockets in their luggage. Four workers from the West Bank were arrested in connection with this. The police said, “The Indian ganja was brought from West Bengal to Aluva by train and then brought

to Perumbavoor by auto. Its market value is Rs. 10 lakhs.” “Initial investigations suggest that this was brought to distribute to migrant workers who gather in large numbers on Sundays in the Bai Bazaar area of Perumbavoor,” they said.

Enforcement Department summons Pinarayi’s daughter Veena

The Enforcement Directorate has summoned former Kerala Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan’s daughter T. Veena in connection with an illegal money laundering case. Former Kerala Chief Minister and senior CPI (M) leader Pinarayi Vijayan’s daughter T. Veena has been accused of illegally receiving Rs 2.78 crore in the name of a contract from her now defunct IT company ‘Exalogic’, CMRL, without providing any services. The Enforcement Directorate has registered a case under the Prevention of Mon-



ey Laundering Act in this regard. The Kerala High Court recently ruled that there is no bar on the Enforcement Directorate from conducting an investigation into this matter. In this situation, the Enforcement Directorate has issued its first summons to Veena to appear for questioning at the Kochi office on Friday. Summons have also been issued to 8 officials,

including CMRL Chairman Sasitharan Kartha. Following the raids conducted at the residences of Pinarayi Vijayan and Veena and others last month, the Enforcement Directorate has frozen Rs 18.36 crore in 242 bank accounts linked to her. Veena is a capable woman and will face this to the fullest extent of the law, and CPI(M) leader N.N. Krishna Das has said.

CRPF Cobra force in Manipur Union Home Ministry decides

Guwahati: june 10
The Union Home Ministry has approved the deployment of CRPF Cobra commandos, who have extensive experience in anti-Naxal operations, in Manipur. The decision was taken in the wake of the renewed tension in the hill districts of Manipur and the sporadic incidents of violence that have been taking place in the past two months. CRPF Director General G.P. Singh, who recently visited Manipur, is said to have person-



ally witnessed the preparations for the death of these commandos in the line of duty. During his visit, G.P. Singh visited various parts of Manipur and interacted with the officers and soldiers there and reviewed the security situation. CRPF Director General G.P. Singh said,

“The ability to adapt to any high-level commando unit is a very important quality. The Cobra soldiers will be given pre-deployment training and training to understand the environment of Manipur. They will also sharpen their skills during their stay in Manipur.”
